CRITIQUE - SOUTHERN COUNTIES CANINE ASSOCIATION Judge: Miss B A Johnson

My grateful thanks to the committee of Southern Counties for their invitation to judge one of my favourite breeds at this prestigious show. The weather was perfect & the ring allowed the dogs to be moved to advantage. The depth of quality especially in Limit & Open bitch was fantastic & whereas it is true to say that my top winners are all closely related, in my opinion they represented the type of dog I was looking for – well balanced, short backed, standing over a lot of ground with sound, ground covering movement. Thank you to all exhibitors for your entry & I thoroughly enjoyed my day with this lovely breed.

Puppy Dog (1). 1 Delaney's Redmires Ticket To The Stars, 11 months old. Well balanced with clean head. Well laid back shoulder leading through to correct topline. Good depth of brisket & well ribbed back. Strongly made hindquarters. Excellent bone & feet. Moved out well.

Junior Dog (1). **1 Jones' Barleyarch Dubarry**, I thought this young dog absolutely stunning. He has fantastic balance & great presence. Excellent head shape with a very noble expression. He excels in his forehand construction & has the correct depth & width of brisket. His topline is strong & he is well ribbed back. He is well muscled with the correct bend of stifle. Excellent bone & feet. On the move he strode out soundly & well with an excellent open side gait & true fore & aft. Although his best is yet to come & he lacked the maturity of the older dogs I felt that his breed type & construction were enough to warrant him the **CC**.

Yearling Dog (1). 1 Adams' Barleyarch Ariat, very well balanced with typical head. Slightly upright in shoulder which gives him the appearance of being slightly longer cast. Correct depth of brisket. Excels in hindquarters. Good bone & feet. Sound, ground covering movement.

Graduate Dog (2) **1 Jones' Barleyarch Dubarry**; **2 Pitman's Pitwit Noble Opal**, larger in size & longer cast than my winner. Pleasing head with good lay of shoulder. I would prefer a little more length of upper arm. Excellent bone & feet. Steady movement, I would have liked a little more drive from the rear.

Post Graduate Dog (2). 1 Bennett's Barleyarch Firefly, I was extremely taken with this dog. The first thing you notice is his excellent balance & typical breed outline. Clean, aristocratic head with correct earset. Strong neck leading to good layback of shoulder. His chest is of the correct width & depth. Well ribbed back. Strong topline & hindquarters. Powerful movement. Very well handled. I see that he is a full brother to the CC winner (their dam being one of my all time favourites) & he pushed him all the way to the wire. RCC; 2 Trow & Jowsey's Winterwell Mr Hobbs, well balanced with good head shape. Slightly upright in shoulder & wider in chest than I would ideally prefer. Strong hindquarters. Sound movement.

Limit Dog (8,2). 1 Smith & Reardon's Winterwell Foul Play, well balanced all through. Pleasing head – cheeks could be a little flatter. Good layback of shoulder & correct depth of brisket. Well ribbed back. Strong, well muscled hindquarters with excellent bone & feet. Sound, ground covering movement won him this class; 2 Warrington & Schooling's Stairfoot Serpentine at Zakova, excellent overall balance portraying a typical breed outline. Good head & expression. Strong neck leading through to good layback of shoulder. Correct depth of chest & strong topline. Excellent hindquarters. Just not quite the rear drive on the move as the winner; 3 Whiting's Ranger Two Rodale.

Open Dog (6). 1 Harris' Am Ch & Sh Ch Vjk-Myst Goes Like The Wind of Barleyarch, there is a great deal to like about this dog & I can see exactly why he has done so well. Well balanced with clean head. Excels in his forehand construction & has the correct depth & width of brisket. Strong topline leading through to powerful hindquarters. Excellent bone & feet. Ground covering movement. In the challenge I just preferred the outline on the stack of the Junior & PG winners – however he is a very worthy titleholder; 2 Graham's Sh Ch Winterwell Jelly Belly with Nyliram, another quality dog displaying good overall balance. Excellent head. Not quite the forehand construction of the winner. Correct depth of brisket. Strong topline & well muscled hindquarters. Moved out well; 3 Lisle's Sh Ch Barleyarch Rolex.

Veteran Dog or Bitch (2). **1 Cotton's Winterwell Miss Tified**, excellent balance. Very feminine head with soft expression. Excels in her forehand construction. Correct depth of brisket & well ribbed back. Correctly bent stifles. Moved well. **BV**; **2 Gardiner's Kilnrae Barley Sugar**, another quality bitch with good overall balance. Excellent head shape. Not quite the forehand construction of the winner. Well ribbed back & strong hindquarters. Moved soundly.

Good Citizen Dog or Bitch (2). 1 Drysdale's Drysike Fleur De Lis, good overall balance. Typical head & expression. Well laid shoulder. I would like a fraction more length of upper arm. Correct through ribcage to hindquarters. Moved out well; 2 Gardiner's Malmelsa Flirty Fleuri, smaller than winner but still has excellent outline. Very feminine head. Correct topline & ribcage. Well made hindquarters. Not giving her best on the move, I would have liked to see her on a longer stride.

Minor Puppy Bitch (3). **1 Joy's Pitwit The Best Surprise at Mannlicher**, really fell for this very feminine, typical puppy. Beautifully balanced with the best of heads. Excels in her forehand construction with correct topline & ribcage. Well bent stifles. Moved well to win **BP**; **2 Pudney's Pitwit Winter Glow**, litter sister to winner & very similar. Excellent head shape. Not quite the forehand construction. Good through ribcage & hindquarters. Moved out well; **3 Pitman's Pitwit Festive Time at Westard**.

Puppy Bitch (7). 1 Trow's Winterwell Inca Trail, well balanced with very pleasing head & expression. Excellent layback of shoulder with correct depth of brisket. Well ribbed back. Strongly made hindquarters. Moved well; 2 Pudney's Pitwit Winter Glow; 3 Mellor & Heath's Winterwell Inca Gold to Evagrove.

Junior Bitch (3,1). **1 Drysdale's Drysika Fast Track**, I thought this young bitch was absolutely cracking & she came very close to top honours in the challenge. Excellent outline – no mistaking what breed she is. Very typical head & expression. Good layback of shoulder with deep brisket & correct ribcage. Strong topline & well muscled hindquarters. Lovely movement on a loose lead – at one with her handler. I will watch her with interest; **2 Angus' Soellis Silly Tilly**, taller & longer cast than my winner. Pleasing head. Not the forehand construction of my winner. Good bone & feet. Moved freely.

Graduate Bitch (4). **1 Edwards' Kacela Seet Imani in Jadenco**, well balanced all through with good head & expression. Well laid shoulder with correct depth of brisket. Strong topline with well shaped hindquarters. Moved soundly; **2 Smith's Indijazz Young Love at Abbeyaire**, longer cast than my winner. Good head & expression. Correct shoulder. A little light through the loin. Well made hindquarters. Moved steadily; **3 Gardiner's Malmelsa Flirty Fleuri**.

Post Graduate Bitch (2,1). **1 Salter's Kavacanne A Sprite**, a little longer cast than my ideal. Pleasing head & expression. Good layback of shoulder. Would prefer more length of upper arm & more depth of brisket. Well made hindquarters. Moved freely.

Limit Bitch (7,2). This class was pure quality with my first three being litter sisters – & from the same dam as my DCC & RDCC winners.

1 Elrington's Barleyarch Beetle at Tequesta, a really cracking bitch with super outline on the stack. Excellent head & expression. Scores in her forehand construction & depth of brisket. Correct topline & tailset. Strong, well muscled hindquarters. Shown & handled to advantage – moving on a loose lead displaying an excellent open side gait. Pushed all the way for top honours & it was incredibly close between her, the Junior bitch & the eventual top winners. All really quality bitches who were a joy to judge; 2 Heath's Barleyarch Ladybird at Pinseeker, very close up to the winner & I had to nitpick to determine the first three placings. Excellent outline with typical head & expression. Good forehand construction with deep brisket & correct ribcage. Well made hindquarters with excellent bone & feet. Just not quite the driving movement of the winner but she pushed very hard; 3 Desombre's Barleyarch Springtail at Braneath, completed a trio of top draw bitches.

Open Bitch (5). 1 Harris' Sh Ch Barleyarch Peanut, I awarded her the RCC as a youngster 2 years ago & she is now the finished article. For me she ticks all the boxes. Excellent overall balance with the correct shape on the stack – short backed standing over a lot of ground. Her head is copybook, clean neck into well laid shoulder. Correct width and depth of brisket. Well ribbed back with strong topline & well muscled hindquarters. Movement true fore & aft with good open side gait. In a strong challenge she had the edge on maturity, & this had to be a factor in the final decision. I sincerely congratulate her owner/breeder who for many years has produced some stunning GSPs. To produce litters with the amount of CC quality stock that comes from this kennel cannot just be luck alone! *CC, BOB & G3*; 2 Brown's Barleyarch Tigernut at Graygees, litter sister to CC winner & another straight out of the top draw. Excellent head & expression. Excels in forehand construction with correct depth of brisket. Strong hindquarters. Just slightly longer cast than winner which was the deciding factor between the two. Moved freely on a long stride. *RCC*; 3 Hammond, Cooke, Mould & Seasham's Indian Sunset over Koolwaters.
